

VEHICLE TRACKING

Vehicle Theft and Hijacking has been identified as one of the most problematic type of Insurance Claims happening in the country. Insurers are relying on tracking devices to lessen the frequency and severity of theft/hijacking claims. NB: Insurers have made tracking device installation in vehicles, and the maintenance thereof a requirement to enjoy cover for theft and hijacking for specific vehicles or vehicles over a certain value. Each insurer prescribes what types of vehicles must have tracking devices and in some cases more than one tracking device.

Please carefully read the below and ensure you have the correct device/s installed as one or more of your vehicles may be subject to these requirements.

TWO TRACKING DEVICES



All high-risk vehicles valued at R450 000 and over, be fitted with dual tracking systems, with at least one of the systems being wireless (RF Unit).
